A warm welcome to our March Newsletter

Dear parents/carers,

We hope you had a lovely half term break and we are very happy to see you all back in nursery. We've had some wonderful sunny weather which has certainly encouraged lots of outdoor play which always makes us happy.

As part of our ongoing work to improve, we are taking on board the recommendations of Ofsted and taking another look at **attendance** in the nursery. At the time of the inspection, our overall attendance was 92.1% and since then we have seen a significant drop; close to 2%. Ofsted expects that our attendance be at around 95% so we need to do a lot of work in order to improve. I'm asking <u>all of you</u> to help us in this endeavor.

One change we have made, is in regards to absences that you know of in advance. We have introduced an absence form. This has replaced the previous holiday form, which you were asked to fill in if your were going on vacation. If you know in advance that your child will be away from school for reasons such as specialist medical appointments or holidays, we urge you to fill in the **absence form** and provide us with **evidence** of the absence, for example, flight details or letter from the medical specialist. It is essential that Ofsted see that we are working in partnership to improve attendance and we can't do this without you.
