Our staff will respond to any difficult conversation with sensitivity and compassion and we were keen to provide you with some materials that are helpful for our teams and also for you at home. Queen Elizabeth celebrates her Platinum Jubilee, signifying 70 years of service to the people of the United Kingdom, the Realms and the Commonwealth. The momentous event is signified with a four day bank holiday weekend, which coincides with the June half term break. As such, schools in the United Kingdom were asked to close on a day during term time. We have chosen the date of **Tuesday 19th April 2022** as the closure date to children. The nursery school will be closed to all Government funded children (AM / PM children and 30 hour children) on this day. If you are unsure if this applies to your child, you can speak to the front office team to verify.

We will be holding our next *Parent Forum Workshop* and the topic is entitled, *Meaningful Maths*. This will be a session designed to support you in helping your child to develop their mathematical skills. We would love to see as many of you as possible in attendance online. We will also record the session in the event that you cannot make it on the date and times offered. The date is set for **Tuesday 15th March 2022** and the sessions will run at both **10am** and **2pm**.

We take wellbeing very seriously at Rebecca Cheetham Nursery and Children's Centre and our aims are to support our children, staff and our wonderful families. 
In the afternoon of the 24th June (which is a whole school closure day) we will be welcoming Booster Cushion Theatre to





## WORLD BOOK DAY 2022

### David McKee is the creator of several well-known

characters including King Rollo and Mr Benn. His most famous creation is Elmer the Patchwork Elephant which is now published in more than 50 languages and recently celebrated the 30th anniversary since the first book was published.

David McKee was born in Devon and went to Plymouth Art College, where he had a traditional training. On leaving college he drew regularly for, among others, *Punch, Reader's Digest*, and *The Times Educational Supplement*. His drawings were influenced especially by Saul Steinberg and Andre Francois.


Don't forget to check your Childcare Choices account to ensure you have re-registered your child's 30 hour funding for next term.

# **The Colour Monster**

We use books to open up a world of learning for our children. The core books we use relate to children's interests and we feed that through the breadth of activities we offer within the provision. We also think that using books as the base for our learning helps children love reading on a deeper level which we hope they will keep with them throughout

their education.

This month's book of the month is *The Colour Monster* by Anna Llenas and we knew we had to celebrate this book in the nursery because talking about feelings and emotions is a skill we need to grow and develop. Sometimes,



as adults we find it difficult to articulate our feelings, so you can imagine how it must be for our little ones.

This book perfectly offers children an insight into their feelings and emotions, naming their feelings and giving an example of what it might feel like. The thing I love about the book is the fact that Anna Llenas normalises the emotions; none are good or bad, they are just a different way to feel.

Emotional literacy also helps with your child's self awareness and self esteem, so books like this really help give adults a starting point to talk about emotions.

It's okay to feel sad and it's okay to cry, just as much as it's okay to feel happy. And to end, boys get sad too, don't tell your boys to stop crying; let all children feel their emotions and get it out!
