A huge thank you to all the parents that took time to speak to the inspector and who filled in the online Parent View survey to provide feedback.

We are also thrilled that this week we were awarded the **Optimus Education Well-**

being Award recognising the work that we do in regards to supporting the Wellbeing of our children, staff and families. The verifier spent the whole day here speaking to parents and staff, observing the children and going through a hefty evidence file that our Deputy Head, Mandy worked hard on to put together. Mandy is absolutely thrilled with the result and has said, "One of the key highlights of what the verifier said was that, "This is an above and beyond school". A lot of what we do is embedded in our culture so it's really heart warming to receive recognition for all we do on a daily basis." We can't wait to receive our shiny new plaque which will hold pride of place in our foyer. Look out for the wellbeing film we put together in our foyer as well and please let us know if you have any ideas on what we can do in order to improve wellbeing.

The only suggestion the Ofsted Inspector outlined in his letter after the inspection was regarding children's attend-

ance. He felt that attendance was not as high as it could be and challenged us to make some improvements. It is im-

portant to bring your child into nursery *every day* Obviously you know when to not bring your child into nursery if they are too ill but most times children with a cough or runny nose will still be very active and can partake in school activities. If it is cold, make sure your child has warm and appropriate clothing on to brave the elements and bring them into nursery. The weather is cold for a long part of the year so we cannot use that as a reason to not bring your child into nursery. Please help us to do better in regards to our attendance by thinking carefully about when you decide to keep your child home from nursery.

We would like to congratulate *Kayleb in Green Room* for receiving a Bronze certificate for the *Reading Passport Challenge*. We are so pleased to give out these awards and Kayleb will be receiving a free book to keep as a well-done! Pick up your Reading Passports at the front office.

You will also have received your *FRED* pack by now and we are asking every family to get involved! Ofsted hails Stratford nursery as 'good' and 'improving significantly overall'

Trust, staff, pupils and parents celebrate the latest positive Ofsted inspection results for Rebecca Cheetham Nursery, which is demonstrating "strong practice" and delivering "marked improvements"

Nursey hailed for raft of enhancements to learning, creating "a real hive of happy activity" and recommended for Section 5 inspection, which could lead to 'Outstanding' grade

A Stratford nursery has been hailed for providing good education, strong practice and delivering significant improvements overall, after a visit by schools' watchdog Ofsted.

Rebecca Cheetham Nursery and Children's Centre, based on Marcus Street, Stratford, was reaccredited with a 'good' standard after a visit by Ofsted in December 2018, with a recommendation it is put forward for a Section 5 inspection, which could lead to an 'outstanding' grade.

The inspection team hailed the teaching provided by the nursery, saying it had "improved considerably due to leaders' determination" to boost training for staff and that "children make an excellent start to their education".

Both the indoor and outdoor spaces "provide irresistible" opportunities for children to engage with activities and the nursery provides "excellent quality resources", according to the inspection report. Inspectors also described the school as "family friendly" and a "real hive of happy activity".

The teaching of reading was hailed as a particular strength and the team provide a "very strong safeguarding culture throughout school". Parents were said to be "delighted with the school".

The support the nursery has received from the Tapscott Learning Trust and the local authority was also praised with inspectors saying they provide "effective partnership arrangements that have challenged and inspired staff."

The governing body at Rebecca Cheetham was praised for its highly skilled people who have worked diligently to ensure the nursery is provided with challenge and support, and they are "clear advocates" for the importance of nursery school education.

"We've come a long way since 2014," said Rebecca Cheetham Nursery headteacher Rohan Allen. "We're delighted that the inspection team has seen, first-hand, the improvements we've made since then. References like 'family friendly' and a 'hive of happy activity' – and obviously the praise we've been given for all the other improvements – makes us incredibly proud.

"Improvement is constant, so we will continue to work with our fantastic school community, governors and our partners at the Tapscott Learning Trust and the local authority, to explore ways to improve and to grow as a team, and to deliver outstanding education for the wonderful children at our nursery."

At the heart of The Tapscott Learning Trust, based in Newham, London, is a commitment to outstanding education for all children and young people in its care.

The Trust was founded by schools rated "good" or "outstanding" who benefitted from a history of working extremely successfully together before taking the decision to form a multi academy trust.
