# EYPP funding justification - End-of-Year 2024/2025 update



### What will the money be spent on?

We use the Early Years Pupil Premium funding on a Professional Development and SEND training SLA through The Tapscott Learning Trust.

### Why have you chosen this?

We have chosen this to ensure that <u>all</u> our staff have access the right kind of training and not just some of the staff in order to give children the best possible outcomes in a range of areas, Mental Health First Aid for Children training, Team Teach training and Multilingualism training. We also have access to a sports coach once a week who offers interventions to all interested children and specifically to our SEND children.

- Mental Health First Aid for Children Training means that staff have a greater understanding of the mental health concerns of children and how they can support or refer them to.
- Team Teach training for all staff means that all staff have the same level of training that helps to transform relationships, equipping everyone to manage distressed behaviours and conflicts safely and respectfully.
- Multilingualism Training helps to support the high proportion of children we have whose first language is not english.
- The Sports Coach offer gives all children the opportunity to develop their physical skills in a variety of ways such as kicking, ball handling skills, team games/sports.

We have also used the money to pay for the two days of a music enrichment offer for the children which helps children with their music and arts and creativity development and also supports their early phonological journey and also for the Booster Cushion Theatre Company to come on site and deliver performances for all the children, providing children with a live theatre experience which may not be accessible for all children.

#### How much will it cost?

This money will help to pay for the 2024/25 SLA we have for training and Development through The Tapscott Learning Trust. The SLA comes at a cost of £9,500 per year for the 2024/2025 school year. The Music Enrichment Offer comes to around £15,000 (including on costs minus the Newham Enrichment Grant) and Booster Cushion Theatre costs £600, totalling £25,100.

The amount of pupil premium money we have received for the 2024/25 academic year was:

#### How will it benefit the EYPP children? Which of the EYPP children will it benefit?

With the extensive training and sports offer provided, ALL children will benefit from the EYPP funding awarded. The how has been outlined above.

## How will it benefit the setting?

Staff are developing their professional knowledge and building up their CPD. They will become more confident in their abilities which will then enhance their practice. Staff are also offered training in Gymnastics Training, for example to help boost their professional development which they can impart to the children.

### How will you know it has made a difference?

Our data is analysed every term and a report is produced to identify which children need the support and depending on whether they have made expected levels of attainment. The table below shows the data for the end of the Summer Term 2024 compared to our Baseline data to determine the value added..

#### What difference did it make?

The following table identifies the EYPP eligible children in provision and their end-of-year attainment against their Autumn baseline based on whether they were "on track". The final column identifies the value added. Children's attainment has increased in communication and literacy, with PSED remaining stable.

## How might you build on it next time?

We will continue spending the EYPP funding in this way as the data shows that children are making sustained improvements in all areas of the curriculum and that it helps to fund a resource that can assist all children in the setting. The three biggest value added have been highlighted in each table. For the second table the third highest was equally shared with four different areas of learning.
