


Parent Sheet for our Book Of The Month

Activity:	Target Audience:
Take time to look at each other's hair and notice the similarities and differences. For example, straight, frizzy, curly, brown, black, blond, soft etc.	2-4 year olds
Tactile activity- Look at different textured hair, products; gel, mousse, oils etc. How does it feel, smell, look? etc.	2-4 year olds
Set up Hairdressers, saloon. Use empty bottles of hair products, tools, reassembling hairdressing equipment etc.	2-4 year olds
Dolly washing activity – Variety of dolls.	2-4 year olds
To use playdoh/clay etc to style different hairstyles.	2-4 year olds
Paper plates activity – to make own faces with key features.	2-4 year olds
Threading activity – Faces with holes in the head for children to thread wool, cotton, and other materials to represent the hair.	2-4 year olds
Trip to local hairdressers, Afro Caribbean shop to look at the different products and techniques when designing hair.	Outside visit
