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READING LIBRARY

Empress, who you will know at our front reception, organises a Reading Library for all our Nursery children to access. The reason for starting this initiative is to develop a love of books and reading in all children.

When your child joins the reading library, they will be given a reading passport which is used to collect stamps for each book they <u>read and return</u>. Children will be allowed to borrow **ONE** book, **ONCE** a week to read and enjoy.

Once your child has been awarded 6 stamps, they will receive a personalised bookmark in recognition of their achievement. When they have collected all 12 stamps, they will receive a certificate and be given a book to keep. Once your child has read 24 books from the Reading Library, they will be awarded a reading medal, certificate and will also get to choose a book to keep.



The reading library runs on Tuesdays 8am – 3:45pm, Wednesdays 10am – 5:45pm and Thursdays 8am – 3:45pm.

ROAD SAFETY WEEK

NURSERY CLOTHING

We had this in the newsletter last week but I thought it relevant to keep it in here for another week as we've experienced some cooler and much wetter weather. Your child may get messy or dirty as they enjoy their learning through play. This is a sign that your child is getting stuck into the provision and fully involving themselves into what we have on offer. Please make sure that your child does not come into nursery in their best clothes as the likelihood is that they are going to get dirty. Also, can you please make sure that there is a change of clothes in their bag in case of an accident or they get wet. Children also love playing with water and water play is part of every early years provision. If you are particularly worried about your child getting wet, consider **waterproofs** for your child; they give your child a lot of freedom in terms of how they play and are super easy to keep clean! There is no pressure to buy, but if you were interested here is a sample link: (https://www.regatta.com/kids/rainsuits/). **Wellington boots** are also a great resource for your child so their shoes, socks and feet don't get wet. After all, what child can resist jumping in a puddle!



Book of the Month



We use books to open up a world of learning for our children. The core books we use, relate to children's interests and we feed that through the breadth of activities we offer within the provision. We also think that using books as the basis or our learning helps children love reading on a deeper level which we hope they will keep with them throughout their education.

This month our key book is **Hair Love**, written by Matthew A Cherry and illustrated by Vashti Harrison. What a beautiful book that celebrates a loving father/ daughter relationship and how they overcome the obstacle of doing his daughter's hair. We love that the book does not assume gender stereotypes and that "dad" plays just as pivotal a role in family life as mum. This story is also important in celebrating difference in hair. Quite shockingly, in the USA, a recent Bill was passed making it illegal to discriminate against natural black hairstyles. It feels quite unbelievable that in some parts of the world in 2020, it has been necessary to pass law to eradicate hair discrimination. Our hope is that, by incorporating beautiful books such as this one in our school, all our children will see the beauty in someones natural hair gifts and celebrate differences rather than discriminate; and maybe even ask the adult males in their lives to do their hair for them!
